THE PLAN WAS UPDATED FOR EACH COUNTY IN ACCORDANCE WITH THE REQUIREMENTS OF THE FEDERAL EMERGENCY MANAGEMENT AGENCY (FEMA) SECTION 322 OF THE DISASTER MITIGATION ACT OF 2000; AND OTHER MATTERS RELATING THERETO.

WHEREAS, Anderson County, South Carolina (the "County") is a body politic and a political and corporate subdivision of the State of South Carolina; and

WHEREAS, local governments may enter into agreements to share in administration of powers and the costs associated therewith pursuant to S.C. Const. Art. VIII, §13 and S.C. Code Ann. §6-24-40 (1976, as amended); and

WHEREAS, the health and safety of all County citizens are threatened by potential natural disasters, which are caused by tornadoes/high winds, winter storms, hurricanes, hail storms/thunderstorms, drought/heat wave, earthquakes, wildfires, floods and other natural disasters; In accordance with the Federal Emergency Management Agency ("FEMA") section 322 of the Disaster Mitigation Act of 2000, the Anderson County and Oconee County Hazard Mitigation Plan (the "Plan") provides for mitigation strategies for natural hazards including, but not limited to, the following: tornadoes/high winds, winter storms, hurricanes, hail storms/thunderstorms, drought/heat wave, earthquakes, wildfires, and floods; and

WHEREAS, Anderson County Council desires to express its intentions to set forth strategies to mitigate and reduce human and economic costs of natural disasters in Anderson County pursuant to FEMA Section 322 of the Disaster Mitigation Act of 2000 by adopting the Plan. NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, in meeting duly assembled by the Anderson County Council as follows:

- The County hereby adopts the Plan and authorizes the County Administrator or his
 designee to execute the Plan on behalf of the County.
- 2. All funding necessary to implement the Plan shall come from: (a) state and/or federal grant funds where no matching funds are required from the County or (b) funding specifically approved by subsequent action of Anderson County Council.
- That from time to time this Plan may be revised and that such revisions shall require approval by Anderson County Council.
- All orders and resolutions in conflict herewith are, to the extent of such conflict only, repealed and rescinded.
- 5. Should any part or portion of this resolution be deemed unconstitutional or otherwise unenforceable by ay court of competent jurisdiction, such finding shall not affect the remainder hereof, all of which is hereby deemed separable.
 - 6. This resolution shall take effect and be in force immediately upon enactment.



EXISITING AND PLANNED ROAD NETWORKS

Anderson County currently operates and maintains 1,525 miles of roads, 127 bridges and over 570 large drainage culverts. These are local roads and bridges and are therefore the responsibility of Anderson County, and are not maintained by the State or Federal agencies. The nine independent municipalities within Anderson County also have roads and bridges that they are required to operate and maintain. Many of the County's road and bridges were constructed in the 1950s and 1960s; and therefore are deteriorating, as are many of the metal and concrete roadway culverts.

Anderson County has conducted a recent inventory project, accounting for every road, culvert, and bridge while rating them according to condition, safety and any improvements required. According to the inventory project, there are currently 18 separate road improvements and construction projects needed throughout the County, as well as 12 new culverts needed. This is in addition to the regular maintenance and paving required on all paved road networks.

Table 8:1 lists the top major construction projects awaiting funds. Table 8:2 lists the needed bridge replacements; and Table 8:3 lists the needed replacements to the County's culverts. The total estimated cost for all projects is \$41,228,000.





- 6. Review, update, and adopt the Infrastructure Master Plan.
- Explore and evaluate alternative methods of obtaining revenue and grant monies to fund capital improvements and new infrastructure.
- 8. Create and/or update plans for specific priorities.
- 9. Complete and properly maintain Oconee County's Geographic Information System (GIS).
- Continue to actively promote the recruitment of employment opportunities that provide the best lifestyle for all Oconee residents.
- 11. Encourage development in a way that protects and preserves our natural resources.
- 12. Manage development in a manner that ensures our natural resources and lifestyle enhance sustainable economic growth and job opportunities.
- 13. Seek local, state, and federal funding support in efforts to expand and enhance educational opportunities for Oconee County residents.

- 14. Promote and enhance access to affordable housing through both public and private cooperation.
- 15. Upgrade solid waste facilities to improve services and allow for needed upgrades and expansion to provide for anticipated growth.
